Born in Monaco, Adeline completed her Masters in Fine Arts at the City and Guilds of London Art School in 2011. She is the most recent recipient of the Arcadia Missa Gallery Prize.

"My recent work aims to subvert the familiar through the experience of 'the uncanny' and to make the familiar strange. My sculptures attempt to provoke tension between the threatening and the safe, while remaining on the threshold between the familiar and the

unfamiliar. Fur is an unconventional material because of its suspended condition between life and death and in this way it simultaneously repulses and seduces."


This year Adeline plans to make the leap from static to kinetic work and experiment by placing motors inside the abdomen of her sculptures. She will be showing work at Art Paris Art Fair, France in March 2012 and at PULSE in New York, USA, in May 2012 with Cynthia Corbett Gallery.

After graduating with an MA in Photography from the Royal College of Art, Jonny won the 2011 Saatchi Gallery/Channel 4 New Sensations Prize.

"My photographs create a new reality with my parents and self. Through exploring our roles and relationships I question the boundaries between us, between child and

> adult, between expressed and reserved, and between real and fake. I want to revive and reveal my unconditioned, uninhibited self."

> This year Jonny will have a solo show at the FaMa Gallery, Verona, Italy, in March, followed by Out of Focus: Photography, Saatchi Gallery, London, in May. He has been shortlisted for The Catlin Art Prize which runs from 3rd to 25th May at the Londonewcastle Project Space, London.
